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HOLY COMMUNION...


Our world today stands, once again, at a crucial and significant crossroads. Not only here in Canada and the United States, but around the world, protests supporting oppressed and impoverished African Canadians and Americans, as well as our First Nations peoples, in conjunction with the renewed vision of Marshall McLuhan's "Global Village" inspired by the COVID 19 pandemic, signal a monumental moment in the potential fulfillment of Martin Luther King's "dream", indeed God's dream, of a new world uniting all people in one human race, "free at last" from all injustice, hatred and violence. This emerging global revolution of "solidarity" (a weak, gender-neutral substitution for the more powerful "Brotherhood of Man") reflects humankind's common, universal hope for communities where all God's children, as well as our children and grandchildren, will live together in peace, without fear of rejection, neglect or abuse. Jesus called it the "Kingdom of God". Fourth century African Bishop, St. Augustine called it the "City of God". Modern, inclusive language calls it the "Reign" or "Realm of God". I prefer to call it the "Holy Communion of God."

Holy Communion, is more than the sacrament of consecrated bread and wine God's people share around God's altar in remembrance of Jesus' cross – although its central importance for Christian faith and life has been, ironically, confirmed during our prolonged abstinence of being "together alone" in the solidarity of self-isolation. More than "what we do" in church, Holy Communion is also "what we are" as church – and what God has eternally intended all people to be! Indeed, the destiny of both the church and the world is one with God's own destiny! The church will not become who and what God has destined us to become apart from the whole world becoming who and what God has destined all human beings to become. Which means, beyond being what we do in church; beyond what we are as church, Holy Communion also describes the mission of the church!

Our mission is Holy Communion; Holy Communion is our mission! The Christian church, including this congregation, is sent to extend God's Holy Communion we celebrate in worship and represent as church, into the world as a living sacrament of God's grace, mercy

and love. Doing all within our power to do – in thought, word and deed – to make our community, our nation, our world a better place, we model the Holy Communion of our common destiny, until God's Holy Spirit gathers all people of every colour in the rainbow of human solidarity, into the Holy Communion of God's eternal life and love in, with and through Jesus Christ our human Brother and divine Lord.

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HEILIGE KOMMUNION...

Die moderne Geschichte der Menschheit steht erneut an einem entscheidenden und bedeutenden Scheideweg. Nicht nur hier in Kanada und den Vereinigten Staaten, sondern auf der ganzen Welt, die Proteste, die unsere afrikanischen Kanadier und Amerikaner, so wie die Ureinwohner beider Länder unterstützen, im Zusammenhang mit unserer erneuerten Vision von Marshall McLuhans „Globalem Dorf“ – inspiriert durch die COVID 19-Pandemie – zeigt eine bedeutsame Veränderung von Martin Luther Kings „Traum“ – tatsächlich Gottes Traum -- von einer neuen Welt, in dem eine vereinte Menschheit „endlich frei“ ist von aller Ungerechtigkeit, Hass und Gewalt. Diese neu entstehende globale „Solidarität“ reflektiert die gemeinsame, universale Hoffnung unserer Menschheit auf Gesellschaften, wo alle Kinder Gottes - und auch unsere eigenen Kinder und Enkelkinder - zusammen in Frieden leben, ohne Angst vor Ablehnung, Vernachlässigung oder Missbrauch. Jesus nannte es das „Königreich Gottes“. Der afrikanische Bischof des vierten Jahrhunderts, St. Augustin, nannte es die „Stadt Gottes“. In moderner offener Ausdrucksweise nennen wir es die „Herrschaft“ oder das „Reich Gottes“. Ich nenne es lieber die „Heilige Kommunion Gottes“.

Heilige Kommunion ist mehr als das Abendmahl von geweihtem Brot und Wein, was Gottes Volk um Gottes Altar in Erinnerung an das Kreuz Jesu feiert – obwohl es die zentrale Wichtigkeit für den christlichen Glauben und Leben ist. Aber mehr noch als „was wir tun“ in der Kirche, die Heilige Kommunion ist auch „was wir sind“ als Kirche - und was Gott ewiglich geplant hat, daß alle Menschen so sein sollen! In der Tat ist das Schicksal sowohl der Kirche als auch der Welt verbunden mit Gottes eigenem Schicksal! Die Kirche ist nicht wer und was Gott uns bestimmt hat zu sein, abgesehen von der ganzen Welt, wer und was Gott bestimmt hat, wie die gesammelte Menschheit auf der ganzen Welt sein soll. Das bedeutet, darüber hinaus, was wir in der Kirche tun; darüber hinaus, was wir sind als Kirche, die heilige Kommunion beschreibt auch die Mission der Kirche!

Unsere Mission ist die heilige Kommunion; heilige Kommunion ist unsere Mission! Die christliche Kirche, mitsamt dieser Gemeinde, ist beauftragt, Gottes heilige Kommunion, die wir im Gottesdienst in der Kirche feiern, und repräsentieren als Kirche, in die Welt als ein lebendes Sakrament von Gottes Gnade, Barmherzigkeit und Liebe zu senden. Alles in unserer Macht zu tun - in Gedanken, Worten und Werken - um unsere Gemeinschaft, unsere Nation, unsere Welt besser zu machen, gestalten wir die heilige Kommunion als unser gemeinsames Schicksal, bis Gottes heiliger Geist alle Menschen jeglicher Farbe des Regenbogens der menschlichen Solidarität hereinzieht in die heilige Gemeinschaft Gottes ewigen Lebens und Liebe, mit und

durch Jesus Christus, unserem menschlichen Bruder und göttlichen Herrn.


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AS ONE WE MOURN, AS ONE WE CRY
